"Giving in Gratitude" Devotional

Read 1 Chronicles 29:1-9

"And now, because of my devotion to the Temple of my God, I am giving all of my own private treasures of gold and silver to help in the construction. This is in addition to the building materials I have already collected for his holy Temple. I am donating more than 112 tons of gold from Ophir and 262 tons of refined silver to be used for overlaying the walls of the buildings and for the other gold and silver work to be done by the craftsmen. Now then, who will follow my example and give offerings to the Lord today?"

Then the family leaders, the leaders of the tribes of Israel, the generals and captains of the army, and the king's administrative officers all gave willingly. For the construction of the Temple of God, they gave about 188 tons of gold, 10,000 gold coins, 375 tons of silver, 675 tons of bronze, and 3,750 tons of iron. They also contributed numerous precious stones, which were deposited in the treasury of the house of the Lord under the care of Jehiel, a descendant of Gershon. The people rejoiced over the offerings, for they had given freely and wholeheartedly to the Lord, and King David was filled with joy. (1 Chronicles 29:3-9)

Reflect

David gave from his personal fortune for the Temple. He encouraged others to follow his example, and they willingly did. Both the tabernacle (Exodus 35:5–36:7) and the Temple were built from the voluntary gifts of the people. Like David, we can acknowledge that all we have comes from God (1 Chronicles 29:14-16). We may not have David's wealth, but we can develop his willingness to give. It is not what we have that counts with God, but our willingness to give it.

These leaders displayed a right attitude toward their money by giving willingly to God's work. This attitude is described by Paul in <u>2 Corinthians 9:7</u>: "You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. 'For God loves a person who gives cheerfully.'" When we are generous because we are thankful, our attitude can inspire others.

Respond

Consider how God has generously provided for you. How can you give cheerfully and generously to the work of the Lord? You can give your time, talents, or tithe. How will you instill in your children the value of giving?

Read 1 Chronicles 25:1-31

David and the army commanders then appointed men from the families of Asaph, Heman, and Jeduthun to proclaim God's messages to the accompaniment of lyres, harps, and cymbals. Here is a list of their names and their work:

All these men were under the direction of their fathers as they made music at the house of the Lord. Their responsibilities included the playing of cymbals, harps, and lyres at the house of God. Asaph, Jeduthun, and Heman reported directly to the king. They and their families were all trained in making music before the Lord, and each of them—288 in all—was an accomplished musician. The musicians were appointed to their term of service by means of sacred lots, without regard to whether they were young or old, teacher or student.

(1 Chronicles 25:1, 6-8)

Reflect

There is more to prophesying than predicting the future. Prophecy also involves singing God's praises and preaching God's messages (<u>1 Corinthians 14</u>). Prophets could be musicians, farmers (<u>Amos 1:1</u>), wives (<u>2 Kings 22:14</u>), or leaders (<u>Deuteronomy 34:10</u>)—anyone who boldly and accurately spoke out for God and tried to bring people back to worshiping him. From a large group of musicians David chose those who showed an unusual ability to tell about God and to encourage others in song.

It is fitting that David, a skilled musician, would take great interest in the organization of the musicians. The musicians were divided into twenty-four groups to match the twenty-four groups of Levites (1 Chronicles 24:7-25). This division of labor gave order to the planning of temple work, promoted excellence by making training easier, gave variety to worship because each group worked a term, and provided opportunities for many to be involved.

The fact that David consulted the commanders of the army also is fitting. During many battles, the priests carried the Ark or blew trumpets.

Respond

God wants all his people to participate in worship. He also wants his people to avoid envying the gifts of others, but to instead be content. You may not be a master musician, a prophet, or a teacher, but God appreciates whatever you have to offer. Develop your special gifts so you can offer them in service to God (Romans 12:3-8; 1 Corinthians 12:29-31).
