



Stormy Weather

Hopefully, the worst of our interesting winter is now behind us. Experience tells me, however, there will be stormy weather to come. Who knows if that will include more of the white stuff? This much I know, the month of April is historically full of storm and wind as the season begrudgingly gives way to warmer temperatures. I fully anticipate this as we near the end of Lent and enter Holy Week. If I'm wrong, I'm wrong, and you can fire me as your weather reporter!

Regardless of what the weather brings, in the days ahead, we will see a different sort of storm clouds gather over our Lord as we recall his faithful journey to Jerusalem, "on a hill far away," and ultimately on a cross. It is by walking with him during this time that we discover a different kind of joy. It's not the joy of winning, or success, or wealth, or many of the things people often associate with joy. For us, it is joy in the midst of suffering, and that might sound strange.

Our faith's main symbol is a cross, a symbol of suffering, shame, and death. Where's the joy in that, you might say? For me, it's a reminder that, apart from God's grace, I am dust, and "to dust I shall return." It reminds me to see my life as the precious gift it is, to remember that my days are numbered, to be ever more aware of God's grace working in my life, and to enjoy the life I have.

The joy of the cross is also a reminder that joy itself isn't something we wait for, after work is over, after a busy week, after the chores are done, but is instead something to be experienced in the moment, in a meaningful conversation, in standing up for someone who needs our help, in speaking the truth when it isn't easy, in living out our faith with others. It is being brave for God. And it is that "for God" part that gives me joy. I can joyfully live with myself, or die, knowing that what I do, I do for God. Certainly, that is what gave Jesus joy, even in moments of agony.

And then, the joy of the cross is surely joy because of what God has done. All the suffering, shame, and reproach Jesus bore has been redeemed. God raised him up. And God will raise us up too! It is knowing that our sins are forgiven. It is knowing that our life, brief as it is, with all its ups and downs, pains and pleasures, is eternally important to God, and is redeemed because of Jesus. And all the joy I experience now, because of Him, will be made complete and be with me forever, because of Him. My prayer for you, as we near Holy Week, is that you too will rediscover the joy of the cross, and live in that joy with compassion for others, with all humility, and with eagerness to serve Him.
